The possibility of a multi-million-dollar law suit against New Brunswick by the hankrupt Bricklin ear manufacturing company was raised here by the company lawyer.

It was immediately greeted with scepticism by Roland Lutes, a managing partner in Clarkson Co., the court-ap-pointed receiver for Bricklin Canada Ltd.

Government officials could not be reached for comment. In Saint John, John Turn-bull, the opposition Liberals' chief critic of the New Brunswick government's heavy nancial involvement in Brick-

lin Canada, said he suspects the talk of a possible suit is simply posturing. In Phoenix, Ariz., Robert Jarratt, bankruptcy trustec for General Vehicle Inc., Bricklin's parent company

confirmed a law suit is being considered and a decision on whether to proceed can be ex-

Mr. Lutes said he has been told the suit could be significantly greater than \$25 million. It was first mentioned by Ronald Warnicke, the law-yer for General Vehicle Inc., in documents filed with the U.S. bankruptcy court in

Bricklin considers

action against N.B.

The documents were released in New Brunswick Thursday by the opposition Liberals, who have long sought to place the Bricklin operation under public scru-

mitted slightly more than \$20 million to Bricklin Canada and says it is continuing efforts to find a buyer to take over the firm despite its fi-nancial difficulties.

The company was closed and a receiver appointed last September at the request of the Royal Trust Co., a credi-tor, after it defaulted on a \$7million bond payment.

Mr. Warnicke, in an inter-Mr. Warnese, in an inter-view from Phoenix, said Gen-eral Vehicle's potential claim arises out of the possible vio-lation by the province of con-tracts it has with the com-

He referred specifically to a section of a March 11, 1975, loan agreement, signed by the province and several Bricklin companies, which says that while the loan re-mains unpaid "there shall not be taken or instituted any proceedings for the reorganization (whether capital or otherwise), the winding up or the dissolution of Brick-

Mr. Warnicke said the clo-sure of Bricklin Canada Ltd. in September and the appointment of a receiver by one of the creditors was contrary to the agreement and resulted in the bankruptcy of the U.S.

There were other potential claims, he said, but declined to be more specific. He did say, however, that even if Mr. Jarratt decides not to sue it would be possible for the creditors of General Vehicle to go ahead themselves with the action against the prov-

Mr. Lutes, who as an of-ficer of the Clarkson Co. is acting on behalf of Royal Trust and the province, said the government took the only action it could when Brielkin Canada could not meet its bond payment.

There was nothing improper in the closure, of Bricklin Canada, he said. Royal Trust and the province had merely moved to protect the province had the province had been said. ince's assets in Bricklin.

"They had no alternative whatsoever," he said.

He said he strongly doubts the substance of Mr. War-nicke's suggestion of a possibie suit. Mr. Warnicke pre-sented Clarkson officials with a draft suit in mid-December, Mr. Lutes said, but nothing has happened since then. He said the province is

aware of the situation.

Malcolm Brieldin, former president of General Vehicle Inc., mentioned by Mr. Warnicke in the court documents as one of the people who might have a claim against the province, said in an interview he has no intention of pressing those claims.
